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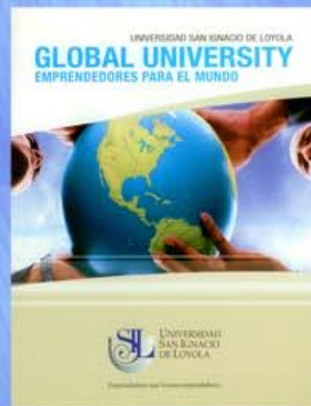


SUCCESSFUL END SESSION OF THE GLOBAL LEADERSHIP WORKSHOP FOR DISNEY STUDENTS

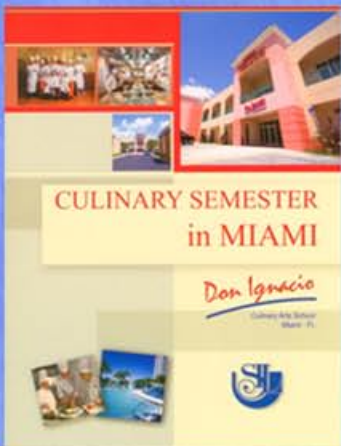
"GLOBAL UNIVERSITY" LECTURE TO STUDY ABROAD
